
ABOUT THE FESTIVAL

MEET THE CONDUCTOR

DR. ALFRED CALABRESE enjoys a diverse career as conductor, educator, composer, scholar, and church musician. He is Director of Music at Saint Rita Catholic Church in Dallas, TX, where he oversees a music program with six choirs including the newly formed St. Rita Choral Academy, professional singers, organists, and other staff members. Dr. Calabrese holds the Master of Music and Doctor of Music degrees in Conducting from the Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University. He has been director of choral activities at Southern Methodist University, Emory University, and Brevard College, and a visiting Professor at Indiana University, guest lecturer at the University of Notre Dame, the University of South Carolina, and the Conservatoire de Versailles.
