About the Festival

Pueri Cantores, the national student choral organization of the Catholic Church, invites all parish and school treble and mixed voice choirs in the Archdioceses of Baltimore, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C. and neighboring dioceses, to participate in a Festival and Mass for singers in grades 4-12.

Singers join together as one combined choir to sing a liturgical music repertoire spanning 1500 years – from Gregorian chant to music of the twenty-first century.
