

#### **Choir Organizational Tip**

As I reflect on important organizational tips that have proved helpful and successful in my parish and Cathedral ministry with youth choirs, I find three pillars especially important.

- •Plan and prepare quality sacred music repertoire from plainchant through the modern era with your youth choirs, while taking an opportunity to renew your Sunday assemblies' participation in sung prayer through Christ-centered, profound hymnody and service music. When we were compiling suggested repertoire for the "Lauda Anima Real Music for Catholic School Culture and Devotion" project while serving as the Director of Music at the Cathedral of Saint Raymond Nonnatus in the Diocese of Joliet in Illinois, we examined the recommendations of the US bishops in Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship (2007) while discerning the treasures of our Roman Catholic sacred music tradition that would incorporate more fully the youth into the liturgical life of the entire Church. This repertoire included plainchant and traditional hymnody, including hymnody that could be adapted for multicultural liturgical celebrations in English and Spanish (for example, "Lift High the Cross" / "Alcen la Cruz".
- •Model great choral singing through championing musical excellence with your parishes' other choirs while striving for robust congregational singing as well. Planning and preparing quality choral repertoire using superior technique and musicianship inspires the vocation of sacred music within your faith communities. Cultivating a strong culture of prayer and liturgy is essential for nurturing vocations while serving as a vehicle for evangelization in the modern world.
- •Strengthening communal and personal prayer lives allows us to be open to the Holy Spirit in our ministries. For me, I find great spiritual comfort and fortitude in praying the Liturgy of the Hours. Other colleagues have shared with me their joy in Lectio Divina in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Certainly, beginning and ending every rehearsal with prayer is intrinsic to the ministry to which we have been called by Jesus Christ. Praying with choral texts, particularly with quality translations of texts in Latin and other languages, creates more personal, profound meanings while animating the musical potential for our choirs. I have found it spiritually enriching for choristers and other liturgical ministers to have an additional day focused on spiritual formation as part of their yearly schedules as well.

May God bless us in our ministries during these holy seasons of Advent and Christmas as well as in the New Year!

#### **Pueri Cantores Alumni Spotlight**



It is hard for me to believe that only ten years ago the Fort-Wayne South Bend Pueri Cantores Festival became my first choral experience and the first time I began developing my vocal instrument. I was immediately attracted to the complex and full sound of such an ensemble and began participating in choirs frequently following that.

A few years after my first Pueri Cantores Festival, I was part of a children's choir associated with the Crypt Church of Notre Dame directed by J. J. Wright, an experience that strengthened my singing skills and was made possible by my involvement in Pueri Cantores. The knowledge and music I learned from Pueri Cantores were invaluable to me as I became involved in parish choirs near my home as well as the Diocesan Choir of the Diocese of Gary. The repertoire itself also provided a much-needed source of quality music for the Catholic Liturgy, something I feel very passionately about.

I recently graduated from Kolbe Academy, an online homeschooling program based in the Classics. I began attending The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. studying Music Composition at the university's Benjamin T. Rome School of Music, Drama, and Art led by Dean Dr. Jacqueline Leary-Warsaw, a board member of the American Federation of Pueri Cantores. For my ensemble credits I joined the University Choir, which has led to what I regard to be the culmination of my ensemble experience: participating in the university's annual Christmas Concert with the Choir and University Orchestra, recorded by EWTN. This has been a massively rewarding experience, and I plan to participate in the Choir for the foreseeable future.

Additionally, the familiarity with the choral ensemble that Pueri Cantores gave me has made me, I believe, a better composer. Over the course of my vocal development, I made my way through every choral part, from a high soprano to a low bass. This has given me firsthand experience with each vocal part, allowing me to hear the inner voices much more clearly and helping along my understanding of harmony and orchestration. Finally, my training has come full-circle, as I have begun more frequently writing choral works based on all the experience I've amassed from choirs, beginning with Pueri Cantores. I

cannot thank God enough for putting Pueri Cantores in my life, and for all the training, development, and experience I have gained from it.

#### **Featured Choir**



Saint Bede Youth Choir, Williamsburg, VA

The Youth Choir of Saint Bede Catholic Church in the colonial capital of Williamsburg, Virginia was established in 2012 and now includes nearly 70 youth grades 1 through 12. The three choirs -Young Choristers, Junior Choristers, and

Senior Choristers- gather for prayer each week and then separate for individual choir rehearsals. The full Youth Choir sings and rings twice a month at Sunday Mass. The choir is under the direction of Aaron Renninger, director of liturgy and music for the parish. In addition to vocal music, all Junior and Senior Choristers work with handbells and choir chimes under the leadership of Carina Brackin, associate director of music. Handbells are played for all service music outside of Advent and Lent, as well as a solo bell piece each Mass. The Young Choristers learn basics of music and rhythm under the guidance of Emily Rosenberger, one of the parish choral scholars.

The various levels of the Royal School of Church Music (RSCM) serve as the principal criteria for music instruction each year. When ready, students are encouraged to test to advance in the RSCM levels. Successful completion of the written and aural tests earn the student a new color ribbon to hold their medal of Saint Nicholas. The youngest choristers learn solfege through the Ward Method. All choristers learn about their faith through Catholic liturgical catechesis. Students earn coins for participation in Mass and rehearsals, and answering questions in rehearsals (choral, music theory, or liturgical). They redeem these plastic coins for small gifts, toys, or gift cards at the end of the year pizza party.

During COVID when group singing wasn't permitted, the choir continued to safely meet in-person for handbells and music theory education. Several students also participated concurrently online for instruction. Saint Bede Church does not have its own school but includes children roughly 1/3 each of local parochial Catholic school, homeschool, and public school students.

In addition to leading the music at the 11am Mass every other Sunday September through May, the Saint Bede Youth Choir is responsible for all music (choral and handbell) for a Mass on Christmas Eve, Easter Sunday, and First Communion. They also join with various other ensembles and choirs of the parish for Confirmation and the popular annual Advent Lessons and Carols service. The oldest students in the choir announce and lead the singing of the hymns as cantor training. The Junior and Senior Choristers eagerly look forward to participating in the 2023 Pueri Cantores Mid-Atlantic Festival next March at the Cathedral of Saint Matthew in Washington, DC. This will be their third Pueri Cantores Festival, and they are very excited!
