Performance practice: The initial Kyrie is sung and repeated as is the Christe. The final two Kyries are each sung only once. The Kyrie should not sound like Kee-ree-hay-hay-hay-hay, but rather one extended vowel sound, Kee-ree-eh..... The musical line (phrase) should be sung as if an arch, swelling up slightly to the middle and then getting softer to the end of the line.
