
Meet the Conductor



DR. RICHARD ROBBINS is Director of Choral Activities and Assistant Professor of Music at the University of Minnesota Duluth, Choir Director at the Cathedral of Christ the King (Superior, Wisconsin), and Chorus Master of the Duluth-Superior Symphony Orchestra. His experience with young

singers includes directing choir at Houston's prestigious High School for the Performing and Visual Arts, where he prepared singers for multiple engagements with the Houston Symphony and the Grammy Foundation. Previous church music positions in Houston include choir director at the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart, and director of the St. Paul's Choral Scholars, a professional sacred youth chorus.

Performance Instruction: Choirs are asked to take care with the notes under the horizontal lines (*horizontal episema*) which indicates a lengthening/near doubling of the note values, and also to carefully watch the conductor at these moments.

- *Communion Processional: Communion Proper Performance Instruction: Choirs are to prepare (and memorize) the antiphon. Verses will be sung by the cantor. Illuminare Publications Communion motet: "Ubi Caritas" (SAB, piano/organ) Victor Johnson
