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Why Sing?

The National Catholic High School Choral Festival offers choirs a unique opportunity to:

- Share their faith with other Catholic choirs from their region
- Receive advanced training from nationally known Catholic conductors.
- Build repertoire and knowledge of great sacred music of the Church.

The National Catholic High School Choral Festivals are planned on a three year cycle, culminating with a Festival Mass in the third year. Years 1 and 2 will consist of traditional choral festivals, including music to be sung during the Festival Mass in Year 3. The Festival Mass will be held in a cathedral or other major church.

 Format ~ Each choir will have 20 minutes onstage divided between performance of chosen repertoire (2-3 selections, minimum one sacred) and further preparation of one of the performed pieces with the guest clinician.

- Combined Repertoire ~ The combined repertoire will include
 one hymn and one anthem/motet, both to be included in the
 year 3 Festival Mass. Both pieces are part of the Pueri Cantores
 Public Domain Series and can be downloaded for free from
 pcchoirs.org.
- Session Scheduling ~ Choirs will participate and perform in either a morning or afternoon session, with a maximum of five choirs to each session.
- Lunch ~ Singers and chaperones should plan to have lunch on their own.
- Attire ~ Options include: concert attire, school uniforms or white blouses/shirts and black pants/knee length skirts.
- Music Preparation ~ Music should be memorized or carried in black folders. Conductors are asked to provide an accompanist for their choirs. Two print copies of the music selections to be performed should be submitted at the time of registration.
- Participant Certificates ~ Certificates of Participation will be issued to all students and member choirs.

- Professional Credits ~ School conductors in all locations whose choirs participate in Pueri Cantores High School Festivals will be awarded 3 Professional Development Credits by AFPC, corporate partner of the National Catholic Educational Association (NCEA). Application forms will be available on the day of the event. A copy of the Festival brochure/schedule should accompany the form upon submission to local Departments of Catholic Education.
- Parking and Directions ~ Parking can be found at one of many nearby parking garages. The closest parking garage is located at 790 Eighth Ave. (on the corner of 49th Street and Eighth Avenue).
- Insurance ~ It is imperative that conductors of traveling choirs consult and work in cooperation with insurance and child protection offices in their dioceses.

DR. RICHARD ROBBINS currently holds positions as the Director of Choral Activities at the University of Wisconsin-Superior, Chorus Master of the Duluth-Superior Symphony Orchestra, and Choir Director at the Cathedral of Christ the King

in Superior, Wisconsin. Dr. Robbins previously directed choirs at Houston's prestigious High School for the Performing and Visual Arts where he prepared singers for multiple engagements with the Houston Symphony and the Grammy Foundation. While in Houston, Dr. Robbins served as choir director for the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart, and the St. Paul's Choral Scholars, Houston's professional sacred youth chorus.

Singing at the Festival made me realize that you can do more than just sing and listen to music. You can also experience it, especially when performing.

Our choir sings at all our masses, and sometimes parish masses. We give free concerts at nursing homes and in our parish, collect food for the homeless and have service days.

Singing in the festival has made me feel more confident about making new friends and acting like a leader.

I think it helps others by showing that you shouldn't be afraid to praise God with your voice, even if you don't think you sound very good.

Our choirs have benefited tremendously by being a part of Pueri Cantores. I've personally learned a lot and our parish music program has been given many opportunities at the Diocesan level indirectly because of the organization.

The music is challenging for the choir, and the preparation unifies my singers. The experience gives them new confidence and direction.
