Plan now to take part in the inaugural season of the National Catholic High School Choral Festival for Catholic high school choirs throughout the United States – unique to the Catholic Church.

Why Sing?

The National Catholic High School Festival offers choirs a special opportunity to —

- Share their faith with other Catholic choirs from their city and surrounding dioceses.
- Receive advanced training from nationally known Catholic conductors.
- Build repertoire and knowledge of great sacred music of the Church.

The National High School Choral Festivals are planned on a three year cycle, culminating with a Festival Mass in the third year. Years 1 and 2 will consist of traditional choral festivals, including music to be sung during the Festival Mass in Year 3. The Festival Mass will be held in a cathedral or other major church.

• Format ~ Each choir will have 20 minutes onstage divided between performance of chosen repertoire (2-3 selections, minimum one sacred) and further preparation of one of the performed pieces with the guest clinician, Lee Gwozdz.

- Combined Repertoire ~ The combined repertoire will include one hymn and one anthem/motet, both to be included in the year 3 (2016) Festival Mass. With the mention of your AFPC affiliation, all music ordered (few exceptions), when purchased through Loser's Music at losers@lmf.net, will be discounted 25% off the original price. As a matter of justice to composers, arrangers and publishers, please plan to order an adequate number of music copies and refrain from distributing photocopied scores.
- Music Scholarship ~ The William H. Hannon Scholarship Fund is available for choirs in need of financial assistance to purchase music for Festival participation. Letters should be submitted to: AFPC, 1188 N. Tustin St., Orange, CA 92861.
- Session Scheduling ~ Choirs will participate and perform in either a morning or afternoon session, with a maximum of six choirs to each session.
- Lunch ~ Singers and chaperones should plan to have lunch on their own.
- Attire ~ Options include: school uniform or white blouses/shirts and black pants/knee length skirts. Please disregard the earlier mention of concert dress.
- Music Preparation ~ Music should be memorized or carried in a black folder. Conductors are asked to provide an accompanist.
 Three print copies of the music to be performed should be submitted with the required registration form
- Certificates ~ Certificates of Participation will be issued to all students and member choirs.
- Professional Development Credits ~ Five (5) credits will be awarded to participating school conductors

- Parking and Directions ~ Proceed through the main entrance of campus toward the parking structure. Vehicle passes can be purchased at the Lake Shore Campus (LSC) Campus Transportation office, located in the Main Parking Structure. Parking fee is \$7. There is some street parking available on nearby neighborhood streets.
- Insurance ~ It is imperative that conductors of traveling choirs consult and work in cooperation with insurance and child protection offices in their dioceses.
